

# **OFFICIAL INFORMATION ACT REQUEST 2022/04**

Thank you for your Official Information Act (OIA) request, received 28 March 2022 which requested:

- 1. what proportion of cannabis referendum voters are citizens?
- 2. how many permanent residents voted for / against the cannabis referendum? vs citizens.
- 3. how many overseas votes were for / against it?
- 4. how many members of the communist party of China are currently enrolled to vote in NZ elections? (ask NZSIS / GCSB for a copy of the leaked list of one million members found in 2016 for this, it may be possible to use the list to find commies in NZ for deportation etc)
- 5. what is the total number of "investor plus" category residency applications have been approved in the past 20- years?

# Questions 1, 2 and 4

Under section 18(g) of the OIA these requests are refused because the information is not held by the Electoral Commission, and we have no grounds to believe it is held by another agency.
